Community Clinic provides important primary health care services for you and your family. If you want to stay healthy, or if you are sick

and need to see a doctor or medical professional, CCI can give you the medical attention you need.

In addition, CCI administers the Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) program for Montgomery and sections of northwestern Prince George's counties. WIC provides nutrition education and supplemental foods at no cost to eligible women, infants, and children under five years of age.

Community Clinic welcomes adults and children in need of health care and nutrition services. With clinic sites located in your neighborhood, you can receive medical attention or WIC services close to where you live. We are here to keep you and your family healthy—at low rates you can afford.

What services are available?

Who are the staff?

The staff includes board certified physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, mental health therapists, medical assistants, nutritionists, and registered dietitians. All clinics have multilingual staff.

How do I receive CCI services?

Call the clinic of your choice (listed on the back of this brochure) for medical services and ask to make an appointment. The patient representative will ask if you have health insurance. If you don't have insurance, you can still receive medical care at the clinics. The patient representative will give you information about the CCI sliding scale of reduced fees for service and help determine eligibility for you and your family. The patient representative will make the appointment for you, ask you to bring in some proof of income, and ask that you come early to fill out forms. The clinic staff will call you the day before your appointment to confirm you are coming. If for any reason you must cancel, please

call the clinic the day before to let us know and to reschedule.

What will happen at my first medical visit?

At your first visit, you will be enrolled as a CCI patient. You will be given some papers to fill out; then you are ready to see the provider. The staff will call your name and you will be shown to an exam room. Remember to come early.

What if I need lab tests or a specialist?

If the doctor requests any lab work, x-rays, a sonogram, or a mammogram, the doctor will fill out a form for the tests. If you can get lab work done at CCI during your visit, you will get a discount. Please bring some extra money so you can pay at the clinic. If you must go to a nearby lab, the staff will give you directions.

If you need a specialist for continued care, the doctor will write a referral.

How do I pay for services?
